Malay Muslim Fathering Month 2024 offers bonding and meaningful interactions for families

Singapore, 27 August 2024 – The seventh edition of the Malay Muslim Fathering Month (Bulan Kebapaan), an initiative by Centre for Fathering (CFF) and Bapa Sepanjang Hayat (BSH), will kick off on 31 August 2024 with a series of exciting programmes for fathers and families that takes place between August to September.

This year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month, themed *Awareness*, encourages fathers to be aware of the important role they play in their children's lives and stay connected with them through meaningful conversations and active participation in their activities.

The annual Malay Muslim Fathering highlights the importance of an involved father to their children and encourages fathers to be present for their families. Through this year's initiative, CFF and BSH will reach over 3,500 fathers and family members. Mr Zhulkarnain Abdul Rahim, Member of Parliament for Chua Chu Kang GRC, will be the guest-of-honour.

"Today's Malay Muslim fathers increasingly recognise the importance of being present and spending quality time with their children. Many fathers are playing an active role in their children's life. Fathers who are present and intentional in their parenting, contribute to their children's short- to long-term well-being and development," said Dr Xander Ong, CEO, Centre for Fathering.

He added that the Malay Muslim Fathering Month offer these fathers a valuable opportunity to bond with their families as well as connect with the larger community so that they can support each other and grow together.

Each year, CFF honours fathers through the Celebrating Fathers during Father's Day in June. However, the Malay Muslim community is not able to join in the celebrations due to Ramadan and Hari Raya. As such, the Malay Muslim Fathering Month is held in September so that Malay Muslim fathers and their families can participate in family bonding activities after the busy Hari Raya period.

Month-Long Series of Activities

The key highlight of this year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month include Jamming With Dad – a competition where fathers and children team up to showcase their musical talent. Cultural medallion recipient and retired singer, Rahimah Rahim will be the guest judge for the competition.

Other highlights include Adventure With Dad – an activity for fathers to foster communication and deepen bonding with their children through adventure-learning on a rock wall, dark maze, and high elements, and Bapa Sepanjang Hayat Cup, a futsal tournament with 45 participating teams.

Families can also look forward to father-children bonding activities such as prawning and go-karting, a town hall discussion on fathering with Deputy Mufti, and a parenting workshop to help parents navigate the challenging teenage years.

This year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month will culminate with the Father Proud Walk, an event which is expected to gather over 150 fathers and their families to celebrate the success of the initiative. The walk aims to showcase the fathers' commitment to increasing their involvement in their children's lives and fostering community support among one another.
