Inspiring fathers to strengthen their families



Centre for Fathering (CFF) is a non-profit organisation founded in 2000 to promote active and involved fathering in Singapore. The organisation turns the hearts of fathers and children towards each other by inspiring and activating fathers to strengthen families, while activating men and women to become effective fathers and mothers for their children.

CFF is privileged to receive the Charity Transparency Award in 2022, 2023 and 2024 – an award that recognises charities that adopt good transparency and governance standards.



In 2009, Singapore's nationwide fathering movement DADs for Life was founded to inspire and mobilise fathers to become more involved and a good influence to their children through ACT:

- Be Aware of the importance of a father's role
- Commit to being good fathers and role models to their children
- Spend Time, acquire Tools, and bring Transformation to lives

CFF has been the driving force for the DADs for Life movement since 2015.



On Mother's Day 2019, DADs for Life partnered with a group of mother volunteers to launch a national ground-up movement – MUMs for Life to complement the work of DADs for Life.

MUMs for Life celebrates a mum's identity as daughter, woman, wife, and mother, and aims to help mums become confident in their unique identity and multiple roles. This enables them to better nurture their children and encourage dads to strengthen families in an increasingly complex world.

The most valuable gift from a father is his love for his children and being present in their lives.

This simple yet profound belief has been at the heart of Centre for Fathering (CFF) for the past 24 years. It's driven to equip more than 70,000 fathers and 8,000 mothers to date, through programmes and workshops conducted in schools, prisons, religious organisations, and companies. And our outreach efforts to create awareness of the importance of fathering have reached more than 3.9M people this year.

This is why we're honoured to have Minister for Culture, Community and Youth, and Second Minister for Law Mr Edwin Tong join us as Patron of Centre for Fathering in 2024 – lending his voice and heart to bring fathers and children closer together.

This year marks the 15th anniversary of DADs for Life and the fifth anniversary of MUMs for Life — a ground-up movement founded on Mother's Day 2019 to complement DADs for Life. Mothers and fathers play distinct yet equally important roles in shaping the next generation, and our work celebrates this synergy. Through initiatives such as Dad's Day Out, Back to School With Dad, Eat With Your Family Day, Great Companies for Dads Awards, and Mum's Day Out, we continue to champion stronger family bonds.

Beyond events, we equip parents with essential skills through a range of workshops designed for different stages of their parenting journey. Fathers benefit from our ICAN Fathering Workshop, while Adventure With Dad creates meaningful father-child experiences. Mothers have found support through the Redefined Series, and parents navigating transitions — whether from K2 to P1, or raising teenagers — can get guidance through our workshops.

Our outreach also extends deeply into various communities. Bapa Sepanjang Hayat, Ibu Sepanjang Hayat, and Appa Valnaal Uravu ensure that fathering and parenting support reaches diverse groups of people. Meanwhile, our work in prisons has impacted over 1,800 fathers since 2016. Through workshops, these fathers get to strengthen bonds with their children and lay the foundation for a new chapter in their lives.

We are also honoured to have received the Charity Transparency Award in 2022, 2023 and 2024 — an affirmation of our commitment to good governance and stewardship. None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of passionate volunteers, generous sponsors, and dedicated community partners. Your contributions empower us to strengthen families and nurture deeper parent-child bonds.

As we work towards raising \$2.5 million each year, we hope you can join us on this meaningful journey — to turn hearts, strengthen families, and give more fathers and mothers what they need to create lasting impact in their children's lives.



It's my second year as CEO of Centre for Fathering (CFF), and I continue to be inspired by the growing movement of fathers who are deeply committed to their families.

In April 2024, I had the privilege of representing CFF at the United Nation's Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW). At first glance, one might ask: What is a father doing at a women's rights convention? But the answer is simple. Fathers play a vital role in empowering and supporting their wives — the mothers of their children, while serving as positive role models for their sons and daughters.

During the convention, CFF highlighted the increasing number of fathers who want to play an active role in their children's lives, and championed increased paternity leave and shared parental leave. In November 2024, we were heartened to hear the announcement that our government-paid paternity leave would increase from two to four weeks, with an additional ten weeks of shared parental leave. These policies lay the foundation for stronger marriages, healthier families, and a more supportive environment for working parents. After all, research has shown that children whose fathers are actively involved from birth experience better emotional, social, and cognitive development.

As we look ahead, CFF remains committed to driving positive change. We are embarking on a new initiative to equip fathers to be more active during the first 1,000 days of their child's life. We will also continue to work with organisations to support working fathers and mothers. This includes running initiatives like Eat With Your Family Day and Great Companies for Dads Awards, providing resources, and supporting organisations to form father and mother groups.

These initiatives send a powerful message: Parenthood is a joint responsibility. Aside from being able to support the child's development, the father is also the most suitable person to support his wife during pregnancy, childbirth and her transition back to work. Good teamwork between the father and mother can reduce stress and ensure that the load does not simply fall on one parent.

At the end of the day, when the father and mother stand together as supportive partners, the family and community will thrive. Together, we can shape a future where every child grows up with the love and guidance of an engaged father.



ADVENTURE WITH DAD

Featuring thrilling highlights such as rock climbing, high elements, a dark maze as well as a special time of affirmation, this session provides a platform to foster father-child interaction and communication to form cherished memories!

BREAKFAST WITH DAD

In this experiential workshop, fathers will prepare and share a breakfast with their children while expressing love and warmth and engaging them in meaningful conversations. The session enables fathers to foster better communication and closer bonds with their children.

FUN WITH DAD

This workshop utilises experiential learning methods to coach fathers to relate to their children. The session includes games and activities designed to encourage collaboration and conversations, as well as opportunities to connect or reconnect.

ICAN FATHERING WORKSHOP

In this instructional, inspiring, and interactive workshop catered to fathers at all life stages, discover your fathering style, and understand how you can draw on your own strengths to be a better father.

JUST FOR MUMS

CALM OVER CHAOS SERIES

Mothers can influence the emotional climate at home. This interactive workshop helps mums learn how to better cope with emotional experiences, and explore ways to strengthen their emotional resilience by recharging, repairing, and regaining control.



HEART OF A MOTHER EXPERIENCE

Heart Of A Mother Experience (HOME) aims to build safe spaces for mothers to come together and share their joys and struggles, so they can seek wholeness and fulfilment. This is a journey to speak to the hearts of mothers and bring out the best in them and their families. Under HOME, mums will be affirmed and empowered through the W.I.S.D.O.M. Approach.

REDEFINED SERIES

Modern motherhood can be demanding. Through the Redefined Series, mums learn how to navigate the transformation of their new full selves by exploring their sense of worth and equipping themselves with techniques to support their well-being.

MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE

BIG SCHOOL, BIG CHANGES

The start of primary school education can be unnerving for the child and parents. This engaging talk is designed to offer parents practical insights and tips through the HI-FIVE approach and help them prepare and support their child as the school year kicks off.

TWEENS TO TEENS

Research on parenting teens indicates that those with the 'highest parental satisfaction come from those who are more communicative with their teens'. Through this talk, parents are equipped with a better understanding of their tween-agers' challenges, and techniques to respond in ways that nurture their relationship.

NAVIGATING THE TEEN YEARS

With a focus on highlighting the importance of fathers in developing emotionally healthy teens, the workshop equips fathers to guide their teens into young adulthood. Fathers will learn that their role goes beyond setting boundaries, and extends to being a nurturer and building confidence and resilience in their teens.

RAISING COURAGEOUS CHILDREN

It is natural for parents to be protective of their children. Through this talk, parents will uncover the ways in which they may be a hindrance to their children's healthy development, and discover how they can help to grow their children's resilience.

PARENTING IN THE DIGITAL AGE

This workshop empowers parents and offers valuable insights and practical advice for guiding children in the digital realm. From understanding online platforms to fostering critical thinking skills, this session aims to equip parents on their digital journey.

THE GAMING DAD

This talk weaves in a father's perspective on managing a gaming child, and the impact on the family when a gaming father loses control. The interactive session will expand on the father's role, and recommend approaches to better understand and connect with your gaming child. Mums are welcome to attend this session as well.

TALKS

Centre for Fathering offers talks on topics relating to marriage, family, and fathering. They usually run for 1 hour (45-minute presentation with a 15-minute Q&A) and are suitable for organisation and community events.

Celebrating Fathers 2024, themed "My Dad, My Playmate," is a beautiful reminder of the special bond between fathers and their children, highlighting the joy and fun that come from spending time together through play. Fathers play a vital role in their children's lives not just as providers, but also as playmates and companions.

The ninth edition of this initiative, with Guest of Honour Mr. Chee Hong Tat, Minister for Transport and Second Minister for Finance, celebrated the spirit of adventure and exploration that fathers bring into their children's lives, creating cherished moments that will be treasured for a lifetime. First launched in 2016, the annual Celebrating Fathers campaign is a nationwide initiative to affirm and appreciate fathers.

Dad's Day Out, the pinnacle event of Celebrating Fathers on 16 June 2024, saw about 7,000 fathers and family members having fun with activities ranging from human foosball and obstacle challenges to bouncy castles and ball pits. A special highlight was the Dads Babywearing Walk setting a record for the "Most Number of Dads in a Babywearing Walk" in the Singapore Book of Records, achieved with 38 fathers. This event brought fathers together to share in the joy of carrying their children close to their hearts.

OVER 140 SCHOOLS PARTICIPATE IN ART COMPETITION CELEBRATING MOTHER'S DAY

In celebration of Mother's Day, an art competition themed 'A Mother's Love' witnessed an overwhelming participation of over 140 schools, resulting in more than 600 captivating submissions. 10 winning pieces from each of the three categories - Preschool, Primary, and Upper Primary - were unveiled and presented with prizes by Guest of Honour, Ms. Hany Soh, Member of Parliament and Grassroots Adviser for Marsiling Yew-Tee GRC (Woodgrove), at the Mum's Day Out event on 11 and 12 May 2024 at One Holland Village.

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES IN COMPANIES

Centre for Fathering worked with ExxonMobil's parent support group in Singapore to conduct the ICAN Fathering Workshop from April to September 2024. The sessions covered essential aspects of effective fathering, namely, the impact of fathers, fathering profiles, and a deep dive into the ICAN framework -Involvement, Consistency, Awareness, and Nurturance. Each session attracted an average of 10 fathers, equipping them with practical strategies to enhance their fathering journey. Fathers who attended the workshop shared that they learnt the importance of giving their best time — and not just leftover moments — to their children. They also learnt about communicating expectations upfront to prevent misunderstandings and aligning with their spouses to respond more consistently to the child.

A 'Parenting in the Digital Age' session was hosted by the Women Leaders of Abbott employee network group at Abbott in Singapore on 27 November 2024. This session featured Alsen Chanamuto from the Centre for Fathering, who shared insights and tools with the audience to support their digital parenting journey. The session explored technology's potential for good, strategies for setting healthy screen-time boundaries, and the importance of role modelling. Participants found the session insightful, engaging and practical, with appreciation for the speakers' depth of knowledge on the subject. The event left attending parents and caregivers feeling better equipped with strategies to foster a healthier relationship with technology in their families.





BONDING AND MEANINGFUL INTERACTIONS FOR FAMILIES AT MALAY MUSLIM FATHERING MONTH

The seventh edition of the Malay Muslim Fathering Month (Bulan Kebapaan), an initiative by Centre for Fathering and Bapa Sepanjang Hayat, kicked off on 31 August 2024 with a series of exciting programmes for fathers and families that took place between August to September.

This year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month, themed Awareness, encourages fathers to be aware of the important role they play in their children's lives and stay connected with them through meaningful conversations and active participation in their activities.

The annual Malay Muslim Fathering highlights the importance of an involved father to their children and encourages fathers to be present for their families. Through this year's initiative, CFF and BSH reached over 3,500 fathers and family members. Mr Zhulkarnain Abdul Rahim, Grassroots Adviser to Chua Chu Kang GRC Grassroots Organisation, was the Guest of Honour.

The key highlight of this year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month include Jamming With Dad - a competition where five teams of fathers and children showcased their musical talent. Cultural medallion recipient and retired singer, Rahimah Rahim graced the competition as the guest judge.







The Board reviews and regularly monitors the effectiveness of the organisation's fundamental operating, financial plans, policies, and decisions, including the execution of its strategies and objectives. It also seeks to enhance long-term value to Centre for Fathering's beneficiaries by promoting and sustaining the active fathering movement in Singapore.

TERM LIMIT OF BOARD

To ensure succession planning and organisational sustainability, Centre for Fathering's Board has a term limit of 10 years. In particular, the Board Chairman and Finance Committee Chairman have a term limit of four years.
