As we came out of the COVID-19 season, we were able to resume many activities which had been on hold the past three years.

The Centre for Fathering Charity Golf returned on 3 March 2022 at the Laguna National Masters Course. This event took place in 2018 and 2019 but when we were planning for the next edition, we were hit by the COVID-19 pandemic and had to shelve our plans for the next two years. Despite the hiatus, we are heartened by the support of our generous donors who snapped up the 33 golf flights within weeks of launching the flight sales. We are also thankful for the support from our guest-of-honour Mr Edwin Tong, Minister for Culture, Community and Youth.

Dad's Day Out 2022 Challenge @ Sentosa was once again the key highlight and culminating point of the Celebrating Fathers series of activities this year, after a two-year hiatus due to COVID-19. Mr Chan Chun Sing, Minister for Education, was guest-of-honour for the event which saw over 2,700 families participating in the activities over the weekend.

In conjunction with the Year of Celebrating SG Families, we also launched Ibu Sepanjang Hayat [MUMs for Life for the Malay Muslim Community], at MUM's Day Out on 8 May 2022 with Ms Sun Xueling, Minister of State for Social and Family Development, as guest-of-honour.

We have also resumed many physical workshops, while maintaining some of the digital programmes created during COVID-19. In 2022, we equipped more than 7,000 fathers and mothers with over 160 programmes.

Thank you for your support which has enabled us to do all these and more as we strengthen families in Singapore.

Fathers Pledged to be More Involved





Term Limit of Board

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








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
