

Malay Muslim Fathering Month 2022 encourages fathers to support each other as they strengthen their families

Singapore, 31 August 2022 – The fifth edition of the Malay Muslim Fathering Month (Bulan Kebapaan), an initiative by Centre for Fathering (CFF) and Bapa Sepanjang Hayat (BSH) which aims to encourage active fathering among Malay Muslim fathers – will kick off on 3 September 2022 with a series of online and physical activities that will take place throughout the month.

This year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month, themed *Towards A Community of Involved Fathers*, encourages fathers to come together to support each other as they strive to become more involved fathers to strengthen their families.

The annual Malay Muslim Fathering Month aims to highlight the importance of an involved father to their children and encourages fathers to be present for their families and bond with their children. Through the Malay Muslim Fathering Month, fathering workshops and father-child bonding activities, CFF and BSH reach over 300,000 Malay Muslim fathers and family members each year.

"We want to take this opportunity to show appreciation to the Malay Muslim fathers who have taken up the mantle and overcome challenges in supporting their families during the pandemic where they become more involved in the families through multiple roles," said Mr Bryan Tan, CEO, Centre for Fathering, DADs for Life and MUMs for Life.

He added, "This is the first Malay Muslim Fathering month since we entered the endemic season with relaxed social distancing measures. It's a great opportunity for families to spend time having fun outside the home so we hope that the activities we have lined up will give families, which have been under much stress the past two years, an opportunity to relax and have fun together."

CFF honours fathers through the annual Celebrating Fathers initiative during Father's Day in June. However, the Malay Muslim community is not able to join in the celebrations due to Ramadan and Hari Raya. As such, CFF and BSH organise the Malay Muslim Fathering Month later in the year so that Malay Muslim fathers and their families can participate in family bonding activities after the busy Hari Raya period.

Some of the activities taking place during this year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month include Jamming With Dad – a competition where fathers and children team up to showcase their musical talent; Special Moment With Dad - a special programme when fathers and daughters affirm their relationship; and other father-children bonding activities such as go-karting and fishing.

One of the key events for this year's Malay Muslim Fathering Month is the inaugural Dad's Forum on Education which will focus on the importance of a father's involvement in his children's learning and how fathers can be involved effectively. Grace by guest of honour, Second Minister for Education, Dr Maliki Bin Osman, the forum will also feature notable

speakers such as Deputy Mufti of Singapore Dr Hannan Hassan; clinical psychologist Md Haikal Jamil; educator Jailani Bin Abu Talib and social media enthusiast Sofian Rosla.

Running alongside the forum is a STEM fair featuring interesting exhibits such as the NKF Haemodialysis Machine and activities such a father-child 'Built and Race Your Own Car', 3D Printing and 3D Pens and building Roblox games.
